1. Wines 1 – 4 are from the same country of origin.

For all four wines:

a) Identify the country of origin (20)

For each wine:

b) Identify the grape variety/ies (4 x 10)

c) Comment on the quality with reference to the region of origin and state of maturity (4 x 10)

2. Wines 5 – 8 are each made from a different single or predominant grape variety.

For each wine:

a) Identify the grape variety (4 x 8)

b) Identify the origin as closely as possible (4 x 8)

c) Comment on the method of production and commercial appeal, making specific reference to the alcohol level (4 x 9)

3. Wines 9 and 10 are from the same single grape variety and the same region of origin.

For both wines:

a) Identify the grape variety (15)

b) Identify the specific origins as closely as possible (15)

c) Compare maturity and quality in the context of region of origin, stating which is the higher quality wine (20)

4. Wines 11 and 12 are from different countries. Both are made from the same single or predominant grape variety.

For both wines:

a) Identify the single or predominant grape variety (10)

For each wine:

b) Identify the origin as closely as possible (2 x 10)

c) Comment on the winemaking (2 x 10)
